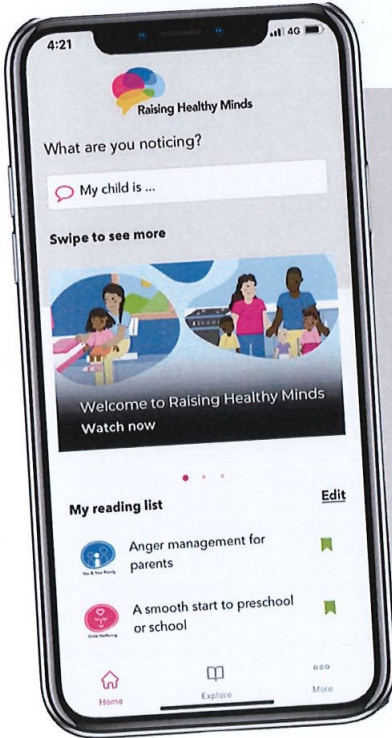


Raising Healthy Minds
